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1.0 Background

1.1 Overview

The Queensland Government has funded a program of capacity-building activities to support Queensland Community Housing Providers (CHPs) and Indigenous Community Housing Organisations (ICHOs), to grow and access funding opportunities. The Community Housing Futures Program (CHFP) was established in late 2022 to improve the long-term viability and strength of CHPs by enhancing and supporting access to training, education, tools, and specialist business advisory services. This program was delivered in 2023-2025. The Queensland Government has allocated a further \$4 million (GST exclusive) to extend the program for an additional two years, spanning 2025-2027.

[Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Housing Queensland](#), [Community Housing Industry Australia Queensland \(CHIA QLD\)](#) and [Queensland Shelter \(Q Shelter\)](#), are delivering the Program with Q Shelter as the auspice body.

These guidelines relate to the grants program for Iteration 2 of CHFP. They are intended to support CHPs and ICHOs to understand the purpose and objectives of the Program and specifically the parameters and eligibility requirements for successful grant applications.

It should be noted that another activity area relates to capacity building through training, education, tools and bulk purchasing opportunities as further support to CHPs and ICHOs.

1.2 Objectives

The purpose and objectives of iteration two of CHFP are:

Purpose

To focus on growth and to concentrate on initiatives for Community Housing Providers (CHPs) and Indigenous Community Housing Organisations (ICHOs) who are growing or likely to grow their housing portfolios.

Objectives

The Community Housing Futures Program aims to enhance the capability and capacity of CHPs and ICHOs to deliver social and affordable housing growth programs. This includes increasing the capability and capacity to:

- Diversify operating models to increase social and affordable housing
- Develop and participate in partnerships to deliver more social and affordable housing
- Secure funding for social and affordable housing growth programs.

1.3 Summary of the grants program guidelines

These guidelines set out the eligibility, assessment criteria, and application process for CHPs and ICHOs wishing to apply for grant funding to further growth activities.

Some adjustments to the grants program have been made between Iteration 1 and Iteration 2 of CHFP. These adjustments respond to industry feedback and the reports from the Growth Readiness Assessments and Program Evaluation.

Two streams of funding are open to CHPs and ICHOs.

- Stream 1: General Grants program open to all CHPs and ICHOs
- Stream 2: Specialist Grants program for ICHOs.

While Iteration 1 of the Program provided a limit of \$50,000 ex GST for grants, Iteration 2 offers scope for larger projects and greater flexibility.

In Iteration 2, grants are more flexible to assist organisations across an increased number of activity areas, and through the optional use of the Professional Advisory Panel. Responding to feedback received in the delivery of Iteration 1, grants are available for higher amounts where projects achieve greater scale and/or benefit more than one organisation.

The Professional Advisory Panel is available, and organisations can use services from this Panel. Alternatively, they can draw on other professional services to deliver their program of activities. Organisations are encouraged to undertake due diligence in the selection of professional services. Those services can apply to join the panel as a way of offering their services more widely. If a professional service is not on the advisory panel, they require approval from the project team.

Grants can also be used for additional personnel to deliver a proposed program of work focused on achieving sustainable growth.

2.0 Eligibility

2.1 Eligible Organisations

2.1.1 General Grant Stream

The General grants stream is targeted to organisations that are growth-ready or likely to grow and meet the eligibility criteria.

Organisations must meet all the following criteria to be eligible for funding under this stream:

- Organisations must be a community housing provider or an Indigenous Community Housing Organisation (under the National Regulatory System for Community Housing (NRSCH), or the Queensland State Regulatory System for Community Housing (QRSCH).
- Organisations must be delivering or intending to deliver additional housing supply in Queensland.
- Organisations must have supply growth as a strategic objective.

Organisations that were recipients of a grant during Round 1 and Round 2 of the Community Housing Futures Business Advisory Program are eligible to submit applications provided all previous acquittals have been completed.

2.1.2 Indigenous Community Housing Grant Stream

Organisations must meet all the following criteria to be eligible for funding under this stream:

- Organisations must be an Indigenous Community Housing Organisation that is NRSCH or QRSCH registered or intends to become registered.
- Organisations must be delivering or intending to deliver additional housing supply in Queensland.

Organisations that were recipients of a grant during Round 1 and Round 2 of the Community Housing Futures Business Advisory Program are eligible to submit applications provided all previous acquittals have been completed.

2.2 Grant Eligibility Criteria

2.2.1 General Grants Stream – total grant pool of \$2.3 million (ex GST)

CHPs and ICHOs can apply for this stream.

Grant category 1

This stream provides grants of up to \$100,000 for any growth-ready or likely to grow organisations, including projects that:

- Align with the Queensland Government's housing objectives.
- Build sustainable organisational capacity to deliver additional homes in the future.
- Support the growth of social and/or affordable housing within the next 3-5 years.

Grant category 2

This stream provides grants between \$100,000 and \$250,000. Grants of up to \$250,000 will need to demonstrate:

- Alignment with the Queensland Government's housing objectives.
- Support for the growth of social and/or affordable housing within the next 3-5 years.
- Impact beyond a single project, with long-term benefits to housing supply and broader system capacity.
- Strategic partnerships with other relevant organisations, including community housing providers, Government, the private sector or other funding partners.

2.2.2 Indigenous Community Housing Grant Stream – total grant pool of \$700,000 (excl GST)

This stream provides grants up to \$100,000 to ICHOs, and projects will need to demonstrate either or both of the following:

- To seek assistance from a professional service for costs directly associated with achieving NRSCH registration within 2 years.
- To seek assistance for costs associated with planning growth activities within 2 years.

2.3 Eligible Activities

2.3.1 General Grants Stream

Eligible organisations can apply for grants to support any growth-related activity, including but not limited to:

- **Finance:** project and business financial modelling, financial risk analysis, and key ratios.
- **Business planning:** project and business planning, preparation of business cases, forming partnerships, monitoring results.
- **Property development:** developing or procuring new social and affordable housing, mixed tenure, sustainable and accessible property design, urban planning, place-making.
- **Risk analysis and management:** understanding risks (business, financial, policy, governance etc.) and managing, monitoring, and mitigating risk.
- **Partnership development:** Costs associated with developing strategic and operational partnerships to deliver more housing supply.
- **Growth readiness assessments:** Costs associated with developing growth readiness assessments.
- **Strategic asset management:** Costs associated with developing or strengthening strategic asset management and strategic asset management plans (SAMP).
- **Internal capability uplift:** Costs associated with increasing the internal capability of CHPs and ICHOs to deliver growth in social and affordable housing.
- **Feasibility:** Cost associated with assessing the feasibility of proposed developments.

- **Development of tools, resources, templates or advice:** Where the benefits extend to more than one organisation. This could include bulk purchasing of systems infrastructure.

Grants can be used for professional services or personnel to deliver the proposed program of work. Grants can only be used for additional advisors or staff and cannot be used for pre-existing staff roles that are part of the core delivery of programs and services.

2.3.2 Indigenous Community Housing Grant Stream

Eligible organisations can apply for grants to support any growth-related activity, including but not limited to:

- **NRSCH registration assistance** - costs associated with developing policies, procedures and business and risk plans to make an application for NRSCH registration.
- **Evaluation of growth potential** - costs associated with independent identification and advice on areas where organisational capability needs to be stronger to support growth (i.e. readiness) linked with follow-up business advice as below.
- **Business advice** - costs associated with increasing the internal capability of ICHOs to deliver growth in social and affordable housing, including:
 - project and business financial modelling, financial risk analysis, and key ratios
 - project and business planning, preparation of business cases, forming partnerships, monitoring results
 - property development including advice on developing or procuring new social and affordable housing, mixed tenure, sustainable and accessible property design, and urban planning
 - understanding risks (business, financial, policy, governance etc.) and managing, monitoring, and mitigating risk
 - developing strategic and operational partnerships to deliver more housing supply.

Grants can be used for professional services or personnel to deliver the proposed program of work. Grants can only be used for additional advisors or staff and cannot be used for pre-existing staff roles that are part of the core delivery of programs and services.

2.4 Co-contribution

Organisations are required to make a financial and/or in-kind contribution to the project, and this must be clearly outlined in the application.

3.0 Selection Criteria Assessment Tool

4.0 Grant conditions

Successful organisations must:

- Enter into a funding agreement with Q Shelter (Annexure 1)
- Enter into a contract with a professional service or employ additional personnel to work directly on their project and manage the entire project delivery.
- Utilise all allocated grant funds in their entirety by no later than TBC
- Contribute to the program evaluation through timely input to interviews, surveys, and the submission of a brief project report and acquittal.

Additional grant conditions include:

- Grants are to exclusively cover the cost of consultancy services by a professional service or additional personnel to enable internal capability uplift. Grant funds will not be approved for general operating or existing staff costs. Applications must include a proposal and quote from a professional service(s) if they intend to engage with one for grant funding.
- Advisory services listed on the Advisory Panel cannot apply for grant funding for activities that closely resemble or duplicate the activities that have already been delivered through another grant. Advisory services are also unable to obtain grant funding in Round 3 that offer activities or services that closely resemble or duplicate activities that were provided to that panellist by another panellist in Round 1 or Round 2.

5.0 Application process

5.1 How the application process works:

- Organisations submit a formal grant application via Smarty Grants.
- The CHFP is a competitive process. Applications will be assessed by a panel consisting of one government representative and independent panel members who will apply the program eligibility criteria in making an assessment.
- All applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application in writing.

5.2 Important Dates

The General Grant Stream round opens on 31 October 2025.

The General Grant Stream round will close on 16 January 2026.

The Indigenous Community Housing Stream opens on TBC.

The Indigenous Community Housing Stream will close on TBC.

6.0 Evaluation, progress reports and acquittal

Successful applicants will be required to contribute to the program evaluation and provide details of the project outcomes and impact.

Organisations will be required to submit project progress reports at six-month intervals throughout the project, detailing reporting activities, project progress, and any delays or obstacles affecting progress.

Projects are to be completed within 12-18 months depending on grant amount and the approved project plan.

Upon completion of the project, organisations will be required to undertake an acquittal process, including reporting of activities, outcomes, and expenditure of funds.

7.0 Conflicts of interest

Applicants will be asked to declare, as part of their application, any perceived, potential, or existing conflicts of interest.

If the organisation later identifies an actual, apparent, or perceived conflict of interest, they must immediately inform the Community Housing Futures Program in writing to communityhousingfutures@qshelter.asn.au.

The Community Housing Futures Program will take all reasonable measures to appropriately manage any conflicts of interest and ensure that the assessment and decision-making regarding grant applications is without bias.

8.0 General requirements and conditions

8.1 No legal relationship

Participation in the application process will not create any contractual relationship or any other binding obligations between the Applicant, The Program and/or Q Shelter unless a funding agreement is executed between the Applicant and Q Shelter.

8.2 Ownership of information

The Community Housing Futures Program respects all personal and confidential information received and will do everything possible to protect information from unauthorised access, loss or misuse. Information collected from you is required for the delivery of the services in accordance with the Programs Governance Committee's powers, functions and purposes.

Community Housing Futures is committed to a thorough evaluation of the program. Grant applications collect information that enables the assessment and approval of grants. Information collected in the grant application process is also designed to enable evaluation of the program's purpose and objectives.

No information about individual CHPs will be reported in an identifying way. Aggregate and anonymised data will be reported in the evaluation. The purpose of this data is to:

- drive formative program improvements
- contribute to program evaluation
- support future assessment of sector capacity needs for designing capacity and capability building programs, projects, and activities.

To confirm, all information collected throughout this process is to enable grant assessments and program evaluation purposes and will only be reported in a de-identified and aggregated manner to better understand the community housing sector's collective position across Queensland, inform future resourcing for the sector and to measure the outcomes of the Program. The only exception relates to potential announcement of recipients of grant funding, where the recipient organisation's name and the funding amount may be published.

The Program's Governance Committee is made up of representatives from the Department of Housing and Public Works, the CEO of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Housing, the CEO of Community Housing Industry Association of QLD and a representative from the Q Shelter management committee who is independent from community housing providers.

There are no Community Housing Providers on the Governance Committee of the program. To seek sector feedback to ensure the program meets and continues to meet sector needs, the program relies on the peak organisations mentioned above, environmental scanning, and the industry reference group. Q Shelter's CEO is part of the delivery team and reports to the Governance Group.

8.3 Discretion

The Program reserves the right, in its absolute discretion to, at any stage without prior notice and without giving any reasons, terminate further participation in the Application process by any party, change the structure, procedures and timing of the Application process, alter the terms of participation in the Application process, refuse entry to a particular party to any stage of the Application process or terminate the Application process.

Q Shelter and the program is under no obligation to give reasons for any decision in relation to the Application process, and no person will have any claim against Q Shelter arising out of Q Shelter's exercise or failure to exercise rights under, or in respect of, the Application process.

8.4 Costs

Participation in the Application process is at the sole cost and risk of the Applicants. Q Shelter and The Program does not accept any liability for any (internal or external) costs incurred by an Applicant in preparing or submitting an application.

8.5 No canvassing

Discussions or correspondence relevant to this investment process by Applicants with parties within or associated with The Program, which is not in accordance with the process set out in this Guideline (or Application documentation), may result in disqualification from the Application process.

8.6 Announcements

Applicants must not make any public disclosures, announcements or statements in connection with any information in this Guideline and the Application process without the Program's prior written consent. By applying for and receiving a grant from the Program, organisations provide explicit consent for the inclusion of their organisational name and the approved grant amount in any public announcement pertaining to the program's execution.

8.7 Disclaimer

This Guideline is a guide only and the Program makes no warranty or representation and does not assume any duty of care to Applicants that the information in this Guideline, or any other information in connection with the Application process, is accurate or complete.

Each Applicant must not rely on the information contained or referred to in this Guideline and each Applicant is solely responsible for obtaining its own independent financial, legal, accounting, technical and other advice with respect to the Application process. The Program accepts no responsibility for reliance that is placed on any information by Applicants.

ANNEXURE 1 – DRAFT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COMMUNITY HOUSING PROVIDER AND Q SHELTER

BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Q Shelter has agreed to provide the CHP with grant funding under the Program, to enable the CHP to obtain the Services.
- 1.2 In this agreement “acquittal” means that Q Shelter agrees that the CHP has met its responsibilities under this agreement to deliver the project and spent money only on the costs permitted by this agreement. Acquit and acquitted have the corresponding meaning. For the removal of any doubt acquittal includes providing Q Shelter with any information that it decides is necessary to show that the Grant Amount has been properly acquitted.

2 GRANT

- 2.1 The Grant Amount will be paid by Q Shelter to the CHP in one or more instalments, with the first instalment up to the value of \$100,000 paid promptly upon this agreement being fully executed and Q Shelter receiving a copy of:
 - 2.1.1 the signed agreement between the Consultant and the CHP in respect of the Advisory Services; or
 - 2.1.2 the signed agreement between the CHP and its new employee or contractor; which reflects the approved grant project.
- 2.2 Where applicable, the second and subsequent instalments, up to a maximum of \$100,000, will be paid by Q Shelter upon receipt of evidence supplied by the CHP to demonstrate 80% of the prior instalment has been acquitted.
- 2.3 The Grant Amount must only be used for:
 - 2.3.1 the Advisory Services ; or
 - 2.3.2 to engage additional personnel solely to enable internal capacity uplift; in accordance with this agreement and the terms of the Community Housing Provider Grant Guidelines for Accessing Professional Services.



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- 2.4 For the avoidance of doubt, the Grant Amount must not be used for general operational expenses or staffing costs.
- 2.5 The CHP acknowledges and agrees that:
 - 2.5.1 Q Shelter will pay the Grant Amount directly to the CHP and not the Consultant; and
 - 2.5.2 any amount payable by the CHP in respect of the Advisory Services (including in excess of the Grant Amount) is the sole responsibility of the CHP.
- 2.6 The Grant Amount must be fully expended by the End Date.
- 2.7 If the CHP becomes aware at any point during this agreement that funds may not be expended by the End Date, the CHP must contact Q Shelter to seek a variation to this agreement.,
- 2.8 If the CHP fails to seek, or the CHP and Q Shelter are unable to agree on, a variation of this agreement by the End Date any unexpended funds at the time of the End Date must be returned to Q Shelter within 21 days of the End Date.
- 2.9 Without limiting the above, the CHP must return any unspent Grant Amount to Q Shelter within 30 days after receiving a written request from Q Shelter describing the reasons for the request.

3 ADVISORY SERVICES

- 3.1 The CHP acknowledges and agrees that the CHP is responsible for:
 - 3.1.1 engaging the Consultant and managing the provision of the Advisory Services from the Consultant; and
 - 3.1.2 engaging new and additional employees and contractors engaged solely to enable internal capacity uplift;including setting any milestones and deliverables and ensuring that the Advisory Services are carried out to completion.
- 3.2 The CHP acknowledges and agrees that Q Shelter:
 - 3.2.1 will not engage the Consultant (directly or with the CHP) to provide the Advisory Services;
 - 3.2.2 will not engage new and additional employees and contractors (directly or with the CHP);
 - 3.2.3 is not responsible for the Advisory Services, the Consultant or the new and additional employees and contractors;
 - 3.2.4 makes no representations or warranties about the Advisory Services or the Consultant, including as to the scope, adequacy, appropriateness or standard of the Advisory Services or the Consultant or the additional personnel;
 - 3.2.5 is not liable in any way for the Advisory Services or the performance or otherwise of the Consultant; and
 - 3.2.6 is not liable in any way for the new and additional employees and contractors including without limitation their performance, the employee entitlements during or upon completion of the project or termination of their agreement.

4 INFORMATION AND REPORTING

- 4.1 The CHP must:
 - 4.1.1 promptly notify Q Shelter once the Advisory Services have been completed and



- the Grant Amount expended;
- 4.1.2 comply with any acquittal process required by Q Shelter, including reporting on the Advisory Services, the outcomes and expenditure of the Grant Amount; and
 - 4.1.3 submit project progress reports at a minimum of six-month intervals throughout the project, or as required by Q Shelter, detailing reporting activities, project development, and any delays or obstacles affecting progress.
- 4.2 Failure to comply with any acquittal process required by Q Shelter may result in termination of this agreement and unexpended funds being returned to Q Shelter.
- 4.3 The CHP must promptly notify Q Shelter if:
- 4.3.1 the Consultant ceases to be engaged by the CHP in respect of the Advisory Services for any reason; or
 - 4.3.2 any new and additional employees or contractors engaged by the CHP have their agreement terminated;
- and provide any details reasonably required by Q Shelter.
- 4.4 The CHP must, within 5 business days of request by Q Shelter, provide details and information reasonably required by Q Shelter in respect of the Advisory Services or expenditure of the Grant Amount, including:
- 4.4.1 the status of the Advisory Services, including the progress to date and all activities delivered by the Consultant or the CHP;
 - 4.4.2 where Advisory Services remain outstanding, details of the remaining Advisory Services to be provided and timeline for provision of the Advisory Services;
 - 4.4.3 details of the spent and unspent Grant Amount (including any invoices or remittances); and
 - 4.4.4 any other information or details reasonably required by Q Shelter (including but not limited to copies of relevant correspondence and advice in respect of the Advisory Services).
- 4.5 The CHP acknowledges and agrees that Q Shelter is required to report on the progress and outcomes of the Program. The CHP must contribute towards the reporting and evaluation as reasonably required by Q Shelter promptly upon request, including providing details of the project outcomes, impact, and the quality of the Advisory Services received.
- 4.6 Q Shelter may undertake an audit or audits of the CHP's compliance with the Program and this agreement. The CHP must comply with any reasonable requirements or directions of Q Shelter in respect of any audit, including providing access to information as set out at clause 4.4.
- 4.7 Any information and invoices in relation to the provision of the Advisory Services must be retained by the CHP for a period of 7 years after the End Date.
- 4.8 For the avoidance of doubt, this clause survives termination or expiry of this agreement.
- 5 REPUTATION
- 5.1 The CHP must not act in any way which damages or is likely to damage the reputation of Q Shelter, the Program, or any of the associated organisations.
 - 5.2 The CHP must not use (and must ensure that the Consultant or any new and additional employees or contractors do not use) the names, trademarks, or logos of Q Shelter or the Program in connection with the Advisory Services except with the prior consent of Q Shelter.



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6 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 6.1 Subject to clause 6.2 below, Q Shelter will treat information supplied to it by the CHP or the Consultant in connection with the Advisory Services or this agreement as confidential.
- 6.2 The CHP consents, and where required will obtain the consent of the Contractor, to Q Shelter disclosing information:
 - 6.2.1 to the evaluation panel for the Program for the purpose of evaluating applications;
 - 6.2.2 on an aggregated and unidentified basis, for the purposes of Program reporting and evaluation; and
 - 6.2.3 as required by law or under any agreement binding on Q Shelter in respect of the funding of the Program.

7 TERMINATION

- 7.1 Q Shelter may terminate this agreement by notice in writing to the CHP if:
 - 7.1.1 Q Shelter considers, acting reasonably, that the Advisory Services provided by the Consultant do not meet the requirements of the Program;
 - 7.1.2 the CHP has failed to comply with the Community Housing Provider Grant Funding to Access Professional Services Guidelines or this agreement (including where the CHP ceases to be eligible under the Program): or
 - 7.1.3 the CHP has failed to disclose a conflict of interest that Q Shelter considers to be material.
- 7.2 Upon termination, the Grant Amount must be immediately returned to Q Shelter.
